

TRITON FACE TO FACE STUDENT GUIDE



DAILY ROUTINE

- Wake up with enough time to get ready for your day
 - You are expected to follow Mariner Middle School's dress code, refer to student dress code
 - Taking care of hygiene and getting to sleep at an appropriate time is very important in middle school. It is important so you are ready to learn.
 - Eat breakfast, we will give you one if you didn't have one at home.
- Review your class schedule for the day and make sure your back pack has everything you need.
- Remember to charge your Chromebook every night so it is ready for the next day.
- Your classes are about an hour long. It is important you are focused and listening to the teacher. This year will be different from other years. Your teachers will allow for breaks during the day.
- Use the 3 minutes in between classes to use the restroom, move/stretch. Take your supply kit with you from class to class. This is for your use only and not to share. The kits will stay on campus at the end of the day and be sanitized and waiting for you the next day.
- Please remember you will need to wear a mask while on campus and follow social distancing rules whenever possible.

BEHAVIORAL EXPECTATIONS

- Students are expected to follow the class rules and be respectful at all times
- Students will use only their own supplies. A supply kit has been provided to every face to face student. The kit is to stay at school. Students will need their own earbuds or headphones. If a student needs a calculator for math and does not have their own they will need to use the one on their Chromebook. MMS will not be lending calculators this year.
- Students are expected to be on task, engaged and collaborate with peers to provide all students and teachers a productive and positive learning experience
- Make sure you are giving proper social distance in the hallways, no hand holding, hugging or kissing on campus, wash hands frequently, and wear your mask.

WELCOME TO MARINER MIDDLE SCHOOL



As a new or returning Triton, we want to make sure you become familiar with our school procedures and faculty, so that when you return to campus for instruction, you are more comfortable with the transition.

If you are reading this, you will be joining us FACE to FACE! Some things will look a little different this year. First of all you will notice a lot fewer students on campus. This will be a good thing because we will be able to social distance the students who are on campus more easily. The second thing you will notice is that everyone will be wearing masks. This is very important to keep each other safe. Some things that are the same is the school day is from 9:35 - 4:00 with 5 academic classes per day. Students will also start their day in Triton Time for the first 25 minutes daily.

Schedule Mariner Middle School follows an A and B day rotation schedule. Every day, students sign into their Triton Time class. Then every other day, it will alternate between their A day (Periods 1,3,5,7,9) and B Day (2,4,6,8,10) schedules

Triton Time is an integral part of Mariner Middle School's academic program. It provides students the opportunity to master individual standards that they may have originally struggled with and promotes enrichment to students who are mastering their standards with advanced level activities.

FACE TO FACE PARENT GUIDE



Hello Parents/Guardians of Mariner Middle School. We welcome you to Mariner Middle School. We hope that with you partnering with us, we can make this a very successful learning experience for your child(ren). I wanted to give you some information about the steps we are taking at MMS to keep the school as safe as we can for your children and our staff.

TEAMS:

The first thing we have done is put all of our students on teams. Your child will move with a small cohort of students throughout the day. Those students will work with the same teachers during the day. The teachers will create seating plans together so students are seated in the same order in all classes. This will help us with contact tracing in the event of a positive case.

SUPPLIES:

We have made small supply kits for all of our face to face students containing pencils, pens, a highlighter, a mask, and a small bottle of hand sanitizer. These kits are to stay at school. They will be placed on the student's desk every morning and collected at the end of each day and sanitized. Students may add to their kits, but they may not share items. We will replace items as needed and encourage students to have their own items.

PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT:

Masks must be worn at all times on campus except when eating breakfast or lunch in assigned seats, or outside during a scheduled break with the teacher to ensure social distancing. Masks will be provided for every student every day if they do not have their own. Mask must follow dress code guidelines. Should a student refuse to wear a face covering, the student will be isolated and the parent or guardian will be contacted. Should a student repeatedly refuse to wear a face covering, the student will be enrolled in a virtual learning program. There are 16 hand sanitizer dispensers around campus and the custodial staff will be more present on campus working to keep our campus safe. Desks and chairs will be sanitized after every use and the campus will be fogged weekly.

BREAKFAST:

Breakfast will not change for MMS. Students will pick up their bagged breakfast from the courtyard and take their breakfast back to their Triton Time class. It will be important for students to move directly to class this year rather than congregate in the courtyard. If you would please help us and emphasize the importance of this with your children we would appreciate it.

LUNCH:

Students will enjoy lunch in the cafeteria or media center. Students will be socially distanced and all face in the same direction. We will sanitize tables after every shift. Students will have a choice of three types of lunch that will be served by cafeteria staff who will be wearing PPEs and will be behind plexiglass dividers. Students will not have to enter their lunch numbers, it will be on a tally system this year. Teachers will escort their class to the lunch line and will pick them up from their table when lunch is over.

CLINIC vs. ISOLATION ROOM:

We will have two separate rooms this year for students who need medical assistance. The clinic will help students who need routine or minor care, like medications, monitoring, scraped knee, or time to rest. Our isolation room will hold only students who are showing possible symptoms of COVID or who have a possible exposure. Parents of students who are sent to this room will be notified immediately and will have to pick up their child. The isolation room will be sanitized after every child.

SYMPTOMS TO KEEP YOUR CHILD HOME:

If your child is exhibiting any of the following symptoms, it is important that he or she stay home: temperature of 100.4 F or higher, chills, cough, shortness of breath, diarrhea, fatigue, body ache, headache, loss of taste or smell, sore throat, running nose, nausea or vomiting.

As you can imagine, for us this has been a challenge like we have never seen. I want to assure you that we are doing everything possible we can think of to keep your children safe, happy, and productive. We thank you for your support and cooperation.
